4. GITAM

Gandhi Institute of Technology and Management (GITAM) was founded by a group of eminent intellectuals and industrialists of Andhra Pradesh under the leadership of Dr. M.V.V.S. Murthi with the objective of promoting quality higher education in the fields of engineering, technology, management, medicine, etc.

Establishment of an engineering college at Visakhapatnam in 1980, the City of Destiny, is indeed a pioneering achievement of GITAM. Responding to the expanding needs in diverse fields of knowledge, a number of institutes/schools have been added over the years viz., Institute of Management (1988), School of International Business (1997), Dental College & Hospital (2001), Institute of Science (2006), Institute of Pharmacy (2006), School of Architecture (2011), School of Law (2012), Institute of Medical Sciences & Research (2015), School of Nursing & School of Gandhian Studies (2016). Over the years, these institutes/schools have established excellent standards of teaching and research and have earned a good reputation for GITAM as a premier institution offering quality education.

Along with its impressive progress in the academic arena, the University has expanded its geographic spread, with the establishment of Hyderabad campus in 2009 and Bengaluru campus in 2012, in the industrial hubs of the State capitals of Telangana and Karnataka.

The Centre for Distance Learning was established in 2009 with recognition from DEC, duly recommended by a joint committee of UGC-AICTE-DEC. This Centre has been successfully offering 13 UG, PG and Diploma programmes in literature, management, science and social sciences. The Centre provides virtual classrooms, unique learning resources and excellent administrative services.

It has been twelve years since GITAM metamorphosed into a Deemed to be University on 13th August, 2007. Over the years, it has grown into one of the premier universities in the country whose growth is closely entwined with the saga of the growth of higher education in the country. The fundamental purpose of GITAM's current existence has, therefore, been to conserve and continue this rich heritage while meeting the challenges of change.

GITAM ranks among the top universities in the country in terms of academic and research output. It has three modern campuses, 20 Institutes, 10 Faculties, 52 academic Departments and 10 Research Centres. The University has been able to make its mark at the national and international levels in a number of frontier areas.

With a multidisciplinary approach, the University has been offering over 190 UG, PG, Doctoral and other programmes in diverse fields such as Technology, Science, Management, Pharmacy, International Business, Architecture, Law, Medicine, Nursing and Gandhian Studies. The three campuses at Visakhapatnam, Hyderabad and Bengaluru are endowed with world-class infrastructure and well-equipped laboratories together with excellent student support services.

GITAM has over 22,000 regular full-time students and 1200 research scholars hailing from almost all the States of the country, pursuing different academic programmes. These are some of the brightest minds in the country, who have joined the University after clearing a rigorous all-India on-line Entrance Test. The stupendous placement record through campus recruitments indicates the quality of education imparted by the University and the reputation it carries with the industry especially in the core sectors.

The University has a well qualified and committed team of over 1200 fulltime faculty members. Sizable number of GITAM faculty have research and industrial background. The faculty members have undertaken major research projects in various thrust areas with financial assistance from UGC, DBT, DST, DRDO, CSIR, MoES, etc. The



University established a Central Research Laboratory in GITAM Institute of Technology (GIT) to enable faculty from different streams to conduct interdisciplinary research projects under a single roof.

The University is steadily expanding its academic activities and gaining popularity as an International University. Students from GITAM have acceptability in admissions to reputed international universities for pursuing higher studies abroad.

The University's research and consultancy expertise is often translated into tangible benefits for the industry and the community at large. All the Institutes under the ambit of the University have excellent research facilities by way of modern laboratories and sophisticated equipment on par with world-class universities. In order to strengthen the application of information and communication technology in academics, research and administration, the University established a sophisticated data centre with a super-computer. The Knowledge Resource Centre (KRC) is modernized by equipping with computers and internet facility.

Further, in order to take up advanced research in focused areas, eight research centers have been established. MoUs entered into with premier research organizations and universities abroad have been contributing to promote collaborative research in multidisciplinary areas. Particularly in the light of ongoing globalization and removal of trade and educational barriers, it has become even more imperative for GITAM to attain world class standards in teaching and research.

The impressive progress made in the research culture is also evident from the number of research papers published by the faculty in national and international refereed journals. They are also active participants in several national and international conferences and workshops organized by the University as well as external agencies.

The University takes its social responsibility with commitment and ensures that the out reach programmes undertaken by the faculty and students benefit the community at large.

5. Highlights of the Year

Some of the important events of the year 2018-19 are given hereunder.

Dr. M.V.V.S. Murthi, who had founded GITAM in 1980 and guided its destinies till his last breath, left his mortal coil on 02 October 2018, leaving GITAM family in abysmal grief. In his place, Mr. Sribharat Mathukumilli was elected as President, GITAM by the Governing Body at its 169th Meeting held on 19 November 2018.

Mr. Sribharat completed BS (Industrial Engineering) from Purdue University, USA and MBA, MA (Education) from Stanford University, USA. He is deeply passionate about utilizing his knowledge and skills to develop renewable energy, sustainable growth and waste management solutions. Among many other significant positions he holds, he currently serves as Board Member of TiE Amaravati and Board member and Learning Chair of EO Andhra Pradesh.

38th GITAM Foundation Day Celebrations

GITAM celebrated its 38th Foundation Day on 12 August 2018. Prof. Michael Warren Young, Rockefeller University, New York, USA, 2017 Nobel Prize Awardee, renowned biologist and geneticist, received GITAM Foundation Award-2018. The award that comprised Rs. 10 lakh cash and citation, was bestowed upon him by Dr. MVVS Murthi, President, GITAM.

Delivering the Foundation Day address, Dr. Young said: "You and I hold these clocks (biological) in every tissue of our body. The daily rhythm (biological clock) rarely follows the 24-hour clock. They have a species-specific period, which is somewhat shorter or longer than 24 hours due to which they are called circadian (about a day). The Nobel Laureate gave a Power Point Presentation on how he and his team had isolated a gene that controls the normal biological rhythm in fruit flies. The gene encodes a protein that accumulates in the cell during the night and is then degraded during the day. The same principles apply to other living organisms including humans.

The University also felicitated the teaching and non-teaching staff during the celebrations. Dr. MVVS Murthi presented best teacher awards to Dr. R Gyanaprasuna (Microbiology), Dr. PVY Jayasree (ECE), Dr. P. Trinadha Rao (ECE), Dr. Manju Jose (English), best supporting staff awards to K. Chandra Sekhar (Sr.Assistant), A. Narasinga Rao (Technical Assistant), K. Govindarajulu (Attendant), outstanding student speaker awards to A. Annapurna, Fathima Zohra and Jagruthi Jaiswal.

Ninth Convocation

Ninth Convocation of GITAM Visakhapatnam was held on 15 September 2018. Prof. Balram Bhargava, Director General of Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) participated as Chief Guest at the Convocation.

During his convocation address, Prof. Bhargava observed that in spite of independent India making giant strides in various spheres, a number of challenges, including provision of universal healthcare and making primary and tertiary healthcare affordable, remains to be addressed, and young researchers can play a decisive role in identifying and providing solutions to them. "Indians are genetically endowed with a capability to innovate and provide solutions to various problems. Though we take a lot of time to innovate, when we do, we provide cheaper, better, innovative and scalable solutions to various problems. Innovations in medical devices would



go a long way in providing healthcare to the poor at affordable cost and multi-disciplinary research would go a long way in achieving it", he said.

Honorary Degree of Doctor of Science was conferred on Prof. Balram Bhargava and Doctor of Letters (DLit.) was conferred on Telugu writer Peri Ravi Kumar. Faculty members Prof. S. S. Prasada Rao, Prof. R. Gyana Prasuna and Dr. Y.V.V. Satyanrayana Murthy were honoured with Best Researcher Awards and Dr. Usha Gampala from science field received 'Best Ph.D. Thesis' award. A total of 26 graduate students received GITAM President's gold medals for their outstanding performance in academics.

A Total of 1995 students and scholars graduated - 1355 Engineering (B.Tech. and M.Tech.), 285 Management, 180 Science, 75 Pharmacy, 40 B.Arch., 35 Law and 25 from humanities and social sciences. Around 28 research scholars received their Ph.D. degrees during the convocation.

Patents

The continuous research pursuit of the faculty has resulted in filing 10 patents during the year.

Infrastructure

The infrastructure of GITAM has been further strengthened in 2018-19 by way of new projects as detailed below :

A 113-room block, Nirmala Sadan-2, to house 452 girl students, has been completed for occupation.

Nurses Hostel in GIMSR Campus with 232 double occupancy rooms for 464 inmates was commissioned in July 2018.

Sports Stadia with playgrounds, pavilion and seating galleries have been completed in all respects, one each in the main campus and GIMSR campus. The Stadium in the main campus was inaugurated in February 2019.

Additional two floors each over Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Bhavan, Sarvodaya Soudha and Madanmohan Malaviya Bhavan to cater to the School of Law, Gandhian Studies and Institute of Management, respectively, have been completed and occupied.

Ongoing expansion projects in the existing buildings (additional two floors over Santi Sadan to cater to international students and additional two floors over Mother Teresa Bhavan) are fast progressing, for completion by August 2019.

A Link Corridor between Sir CV Raman Bhavan and SS Bhatnagar Bhavan and a new block, to cater to PG courses in Architecture and additional Class Rooms for First Year engineering, have been taken up for completion by August 2019.

A roof-top helipad of the Hospital Building, to meet air-ambulance requirements, has been completed.

Roof-top Solar Photovoltaic power generation system, with a capacity of 1000 kWp, spread over 15 buildings, was commissioned in September 2018.

Knowledge Resource Centre

A fully air-conditioned Central Library, known as Knowledge Resource Centre, is located in Visakhapatnam campus with all facilities like internet, digital library, e-learning centre and reprographic facilities. The centre has a collection of over 32,35,174 volumes which includes 30,00,091 +e-books, 408 print Periodicals both national and international , 8494 e-journals, CDs / DVDs, latest editions of Handbooks, Directories, Dictionaries, Encyclopedias, ISI & IRC codes covering disciplines of Engineering, Science, Management, International Business, Dental Sciences, Pharmacy, Architecture, Law, Medical Sciences, Nursing and Gandhian Philosophy. The library is equipped with reading rooms and reference sections. The INFONET services facilitate online access to e-books and e-journals, which is connected to all the three campuses.

The e-resources can be accessed through intranet and internet. The total campus is wifi enabled. This facilitates the users to access the resources anywhere in the campus.

KRC has signed MoU with INFLIBNET (Information & Library Network Centre) for Shodganga for thesis uploading and anti-plagiarism.

Centre for Advanced Technology Solutions (CATS)

The Centre for Advanced Technology Solutions (CATS) manages the IT infrastructure and offers variety of IT-related services to assist members of staff and students at GITAM. CATS provides campus-wide computing, networking, storage, communications and instructional technology across all the campuses of GITAM. The software services are used across all the three campuses while the hardware services are specific to the campus.

GITAM IT Services Enhancements in 2018-2019 :

1. G-HRMS, a brand new portal has been developed to manage all staff salary processing activities which includes biometric attendance integration for salary processing.
2. G-Media, web portal that allows specified users to share photographs of the events that happen in the campuses is under enhancement.



3. G-Pharmacy module has been developed for GIMSR hospital central drug store.
4. G-Meetings portal enables central committee members to plan meeting schedules, feedback and communication.
5. G-Schedule, auditoriums, video conferencing rooms, sports complex etc can be selected for conducting events for a particular period.
6. G-FIS is a web portal for displaying consolidated information of a staff member just by keying staff ID.
7. G-Evaluation processes marks of the students and is being modified for each institution.
8. G-University provides a complete view of GITAM in the form of a Digital Dashboard.
9. Academic and HR profile facility has been updated for all staff members to update their papers, publications and HR information.
10. GITAM-HIS is a hospital management software under development to support GITAM hospital daily activities.
11. GITAM website - a CMS was developed to design and upgrade GITAM website with minimum man hours.

Data centre upgrade –

1. Nexus – L3 Switch is added to reach network traffic and the request is validated before sending it to server form.
2. Internal firewall – An internal firewall is added to address on premises network attacks.
3. External firewall – External firewall is upgraded to the latest model.
4. Rack to Rack 10g back bone – The network communication between racks is upgraded to 10G to improve the network performance.
5. Dual Power – Dual power facility has been added to Data Centre with standards.

Campus Hostels

2607 boys and 1077 girls availed themselves of campus hostel facility during the year.

1. Books of account are maintained under annual system of accounting and in accordance with the accounting standards prescribed by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.
2. There are no prior period items that materially affect surplus or deficit during the year.
3. Depreciation is provided under Straight Line method at the following rates. In respect of assets that are used for less than six months, depreciation is provided at half of the rates.

4. Donations, Rescued and hostel admission receipts are treated as Capital and accordingly added to Capital Fund in the Balance Sheet. The interest received on (accumulated) Funds is added to the concerned fund amount to meet the expenditure for the specific purpose.
5. During the year accumulated funds invested in scheduled banks is nil.
6. Allocation to funds is made on the gross academic fee receipts in the following manner:
 - a) 3% to GITAM Development Fund
 - b) 3% to GITAM Social Responsibility Fund
 - c) 7% to GITAM Staff Development Fund
7. Allocation to the corpus fund; 5% is made on the net surplus after charging to the various accumulated funds.
8. Revenue recognition
Tuition and other fees are recognized as income on monthly pro-rata basis.
9. Fixed Assets
Fixed Assets are stated at cost less depreciation under historical cost convention.
10. Grants received from various granting agencies and related expenditure are accounted for in the extent utilized. Unspent balances are shown as current liability under the head "grants received in advance".
11. Investments are shown at cost of acquisition.
12. Employees Provident Fund contributions together with management contribution are being credited monthly to the Regional Provident Fund Commissioner and management contribution is charged to Revenue.
13. The liability in respect of future gratuity payment is recognized in accordance with All IS (Employee Benefits). The liability is covered by a Group Gratuity Policy of LIC under which annual payments are made based on actuarial valuation.
14. Term Loans from banks are repayable in 5 years/7 years in half yearly/quarterly installments.
15. Cost of Software is treated as Intangible Fixed Asset and depreciated @100%.

Contingent Liability:

Disputed Service Tax:

The additional Commissioner of Central Excise and Customs raised a demand for Rs. 74.08 Lakhs towards Service Tax in respect of GITAM Institute of Foreign Trade for the period from 07/08/15 to 15/08/15 vide order No. C&A/15/15-08/0286/15 dt 07/07/15 and dated 21.05.2016. The writ appeal bearing No. WP/20004/2016 filed against the above order is pending before the Hon'ble Andhra Pradesh High Court. An amount of Rs.37.48 Lakhs will be paid under protest as per the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh as shown under Loans and Advances.

Disputed Property Tax:

The Secretary, Panchayat Raj and Rural Development, Bangalore raised a demand for Rs.64.17 Lakhs towards property tax in respect of GITAM Bangalore Campus property for the period from 2011-12 to 20-06-2018. The same has been filed in the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka at Bangalore vide WP No. 30007/2018 and WP No. 30040-30049/2018 and WP No. 38551/2018 and paid 10% of Rs.64.17 lakhs i.e. Rs.6.42 lakhs under protest as per the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka during the financial year 2018-19 as shown under Loans and Advances.
